The Hub at KOA


The Hub has been enjoying their trees and festive lights over the last few weeks. It has been giving students and staff a warm feeling whenever they come to the Hub.

Its been a busy two terms in Music.

Year 7 have been improving their reading of Music and performing lots of Latin American rhythms. Ask your son or daughter to demonstrate

Year 8 have been working on the Blues. After finding out about how the Blues was developed, they have been performing 12 Bar Blues, Walking Bass and different Blues melodies

Year 9 have been composing and listening to Protest Music. They have produced some interesting and thoughtful lyrics for which they have started to compose backing tracks.

Year 10 have started to cover different aspects of their BTEC Technical Award course, which is a new course being covered by us for the first time. 














Environmental Group and Eco Schools' Committee at KOA

Applications for entry into Primary School in September 2023

A reminder that the closing date to apply for entry into primary school in September 2023 is 15 January 2023. This will be for any younger siblings born between 1 September 2018 and 31 August 2019.

It is important to apply on-time as siblings are not guaranteed a place at the older child's school and the school may fill up with on-time applications making it harder for late applicants.

Applications should be made to the local authority where the child lives; regardless of the location of the school they are requesting. 

In maths, they have developed their calculation knowledge by learning how to multiply and divide in the written method.


Forest School has also been lots of fun with opportunities to practise lighting fires as well as enjoying yummy treats such as popcorn and toasted marshmallows!

Scarlet Fever Information and Advice

Although scarlet fever is usually a mild illness, it should be treated with antibiotics to minimise the risk of complications and reduce the spread to others.

The symptoms of scarlet fever include a sore throat, headache, fever, nausea, and vomiting. This is followed by a fine red rash which typically first appears on the chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to other parts of the body. On more darkly pigmented skin, the scarlet rash may be harder to spot, but it should feel like 'sandpaper'. The face can be flushed red but pale around the mouth.

If you think you, or your child, have scarlet fever:

- See your GP or contact NHS 111 as soon as possible
- Make sure that you/your child takes the full course of any antibiotics prescribed by the doctor.
- Stay at home, away from nursery, school, or work for at least 24 hours after starting the antibiotic treatment, to avoid spreading the infection.

Complications. Children who have **flu** or **chickenpox** at the same time as scarlet fever are more likely to develop more serious infection during an outbreak of scarlet fever and so parents should remain vigilant for symptoms such as a persistent high fever, cellulitis (skin infection) and arthritis (joint pain and swelling). If you are concerned for any reason, please seek medical assistance immediately.

If your child has an underlying condition which affects their immune system, you should contact your GP or hospital doctor to discuss whether any additional measures are needed.
