
**How?** Please enter via the gate as usual. Classroom doors will open at 8.25 and you will be invited to come in. Please then exit via the school office by 8.50.

#### **Reading at Home**



Thank you for reading with your child at home. It is always a joy to have conversations with children about their reading routines and opportunities they have to practise reading at home with their adults.

We ask that all children are read with at least 4 times a week in order to develop their fluency and understanding of the text. Frequency of reading and regular practice is particularly important between the ages of 4 and 11, when children are still learning to be readers. In school, we read with all of our children in daily reading lessons, phonics lessons and one-to-one, through both our Class Teachers, Teaching Partners and our wonderful volunteers.

#### **Progressive Sport Enrichment Days**

#### **Eco-Schools Green Flag**

We are very pleased that the Eco-Committee at King's Oak Academy, which comprises pupils and key adults, have been successful in meeting the requirements for the Eco-Schools Green Flag Award. The three themes we focused on last academic year were:



- Biodiversity each class to grow and be responsible for pollinator-friendly flowers.
- Litter all children to be actively engaged in a litter pick each week.
- School grounds each class will have a lesson outside once a term.


#### **Black History Month at KOA**


This year the focus of Black History Month activities is

on celebrating the exceptional achievements of black women. On Thursday 12 October Lower School children engaged in an afternoon of learning about influential female figures. Though the key texts such as 'Look Up!' and 'Astro Girl', KS1 children



learned about Mae Jemison and her tremendous achievements as she became the first African-American woman to travel into space when she served as a mission specialist aboard the Space Shuttle Endeavour in 1992.







In KS2, children read 'Coming to England', 'John Agard's Windrush Child' and 'We Sang Across the Sea: The Empire Windrush and Me' and learned about Windrush, Baroness Floella Benjamin and her achievements in the field of TV presenting and politics, through research and drama.









Additionally, all Lower School children engaged in various collaborative art opportunities and explored the illustrative style of Jean-Michel Basquiat.


Many of our KOA staff joined in with the challenge, including our very own Miss Baber (with Chester), Mr Cornick, our Head of Health Department, and

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
