Flu Vaccines

A team of nurses were on site on Thursday administering the Flu Nasal Spray to children in YR – Y6. If your child did not receive the vaccine, Sirona Care and Health will be arranging Community Clinics with dates to be confirmed.

Headlice

We have had a number of reported cases of head lice in school. Please can you check your child's hair and treat as necessary. If you would like any advice on treating head lice, please speak to a member of staff.

Road Safety

We appreciate the current roadworks on Tenniscourt Road and Grace Drive are making parking and dropping off/ collecting your child at the beginning and end of the day difficult. Please can you be mindful of oncoming traffic, pedestrians, be vigilant when crossing the road and use the zebra crossing at all times.

Recognising Positive Behaviour

As a way of recognising positive and expected behaviour we have introduced Little Stars! When children have earned 10 little stars through displaying expected behaviour throughout the day, teachers will send a postcard home.

Teaching staff will also be making phone calls home to feed back a child's positive and expected behaviour throughout the school week.



Reading Reminder

Reading aloud to your child has a significant impact on their language development and love of reading. Listening to your child read significantly improves their progress and those that don't often find a gap opens up in school. Please support your child by aiming to read at least 4 times a week for 10 minutes and sharing stories at bedtime. Children will be recognised for this in school with little stars and raffle tickets to win a beautiful new book!
