

Values Through Story



We ask that all children are read at least four times a week in order to develop their fluency and understanding of the text. Frequency of reading and regular practice is particularly important between the ages of 4 and 11, when children are still learning to be readers. In school, we read with all of our children in daily reading lessons, phonics lessons and one-to-one, through both our Class Teachers, Teaching Partners and our wonderful volunteers.






Pre-loved Uniform Sale and Donations

Black History Month takes place in October in the UK.





What is Black History Month?


Black History Month theme 2023














Teddy Bear's Childcare
