# <u>Parent Led Anxiety Therapeutic Workshop – Date to</u> be confirmed


In Term 2 Bea, one of King's Oak Education Mental Health Practitioners (EMHP) is running a 6 session Parent Led Anxiety Therapeutic group for parents with young people in Years 1-8. They will be co-facilitated by another EMHP we have in the school, Beth.

They are offering this for up to 8 young people who are struggling with anxiety such as phobias, school worries or worries they are struggling to identify. This causes them to not want to attend school on certain days, stopping them going to hobbies or events, or separating from parents.

Over the 6 sessions, we will work though Cognitive Behavioural Skills that can encourage the child to talk about their worries, steps on how to overcome them and problem solving. It is based on a self-help book, guided by both EMHPs and research has found that this has a high success rate.

We encourage both parents and carers to attend every session as we aim to form a community, so you do not feel like you are going through these struggles on your own.



We have started to explore our termly Learning Gem Power and our termly value both in class and in our








See below for each year group and when their enrichment session will be for Term 2.




