
Coffee Mornings for KOA Families

Enterprise and Employability Skills

The Middle School students in Years 5 and 6 have the opportunity to demonstrate, gain and understand employability skills through an exciting Dragon's Den Event this term. During this activity, students will be designing a new snack, drink or mobile app and then presenting their idea to their peers. The activity will involve working in teams, problem-solving, creativity and lots of communication skills (Amethyst Power!). These are all important employability/ transferable skills that employers are looking for. It is important throughout school that we help students to recognise the importance of these skills and how they can be demonstrated.

During Enterprise Week, students will also have the opportunity to run a small enterprise activity, again demonstrating employability skills and contributing to raising money for the school minibus. An achievement they can be proud of.

Lexia Reading Support

A number of our Year 5 children have begun the Lexia programme to develop reading skills and fluency. Lexia helps children to read, write, and speak with confidence. It is a learning program that individually targets and accelerates the development of literacy skills.

We look forward to seeing the progress that our children make as they shift from learning to read to reading to learn.

PiXL Code (Phonics)

Miss Eacott and Miss Hicks have been busy this term, assessing all of our Year 5 learners for any gaps in their phonics. Your children will be popping out of class to work with our wonderful TPs as they take groups to target specific gaps in their learning. We look forward to seeing the impact of this on the children's fluency, confidence and enjoyment of reading.

We know that a secure phonics understanding underpins successful word reading and therefore, plays a vital role in developing confident reading and spelling. It is important to ensure that all children are given the opportunity to catch-up on any gaps in their phonics learning through interventions, to ensure that they can be successful in literacy and use these skills to access the wider curriculum.

Year 9 Reading Partners

This term, Year 9 Duke of Edinburgh and Book Club students have been listening to some Year 5 readers in the LRC at the end of the day. The Year 9 students have been talking to the Year 5s about the stories they are reading and giving them lots of praise and encouragement!

Year 5 Transition Walks

Having listened to feedback from parents, last term we trialled a new initiative for our Year 5 learners **who have siblings in Lower School**., in order to support their transition from parents collecting children from their classrooms, to children walking to the Lower Site independently, when parents and children decide they are ready for this next step.

We have had positive feedback from this. If you would like your child to have this bespoke support, please speak to your child's class teacher, who will be able to explain how this will work and add your child to the list.

Thank you for your continued support and feedback around how we can continue to develop our provision to further support our learners and families.

Third-Space Tutoring

A large number of our Year 6 students are now working with online tutors to develop maths skills, understanding and application. The students have really engaged with it and have been using so much Sapphire Power.

Year 6 have been working hard preparing for the upcoming end of KS2 assessments (SATs) which will take place during the week 9—12 May. You may see the children bringing some short pieces of home learning to complete and bring back to school. This is to help embed the learning we have covered in school and prepare the children for their transition to Year 7 later this year.


Camp


