English (I am an Author)

We are excited to start reading our new book 'Einstein: The Fantastic Journey of a Mouse Through Time and Space.'

We will begin by exploring the original text, thinking about the key messages, settings and characters. We will be using our Topaz Power when interviewing the characters and our Amethyst Power, working in teams to unpick some of the trickier language in the text. Our focus will be on using commas to separate clauses as we work towards writing a sequel for the book: where does the mouse travel next?! We will also write an explanation text: How does the Time Machine work?

Unit 1 (I am a Scientist)

Our first unit this term is 'We are Scientists'; we will be focusing on Astronomy and Meteorology. In Astronomy (the oldest Science and study of the night sky), we will be learning about stars and planets, day and night, eclipses and seasons. We will be beginning to understand more about our Solar System, galaxy, universe and how it all started! Some key vocabulary used will include 'Earth, orbit, gravity, constellations, satellites, theory, hypothesis and observations'. We had planned a visit to 'We the Curious' to support our learning this term, however, this venue is currently closed so we are very excited to share that we have arranged for a planetarium to visit us here at KOA!

In Meteorology, we will be learning about the water cycle as part of the weather. Some key vocabulary that we will use include 'atmosphere, condensation, evaporation, precipitation, pressure and data'.

Unit 2 (I am a Designer)

As a designer, we will research current products on the market for our surprise invention! We will then design, create prototypes, test, and evaluate our own products.





English (I am an Author)

We are about to share our new book 'The Giant and the Sea,' - we are excited to find out more about it!

We will begin by exploring the text, thinking about the key messages, settings and characters. We will be using our Topaz Power to discuss the plot and our Amethyst Power, working in teams to act out some of the scenes in the text.

We will then focus on producing well-structured, accurately-punctuated texts which are interesting for the reader, as we work towards writing a sequel for the book: what happens the second time around?! We will also write a

persuasion text: A speech by the girl to the people in the city.

Our unit this term is all about climate change. As well as looking at how the climate has changed throughout Earth's history, we will also be exploring why the climate warms and cools; how it impacts life on Earth and how human activity impacts on it.

Key vocabulary and phrases that we will be using environment, climate, impact, physical, seasons, deforestation, fossil fuels, volcanic activity, solar output, orbit, orbital changes

English

Year 7 will be reading the novel, 'The Great Expectations' by Charles Dickens. The key vocabulary is Benevolent, Benevolence, Victim, Victimised, Morality and Hierarchy.

Students will know:

- Context Victorian England, Church and Religion and charity.
- Characters Female characters and constructs, villains and victims, adults and children.
- Themes Power, love conflict, justice, poverty and childhood.
- **4.** Language C19th language, symbolism and imagery.
- Literary Heritage Novels, Victorian novels, Dickens as a social commentator and reformer.



PE

This term, we will learn and apply skills and techniques in a range of activities, so that we can develop a desire to take part and be the best they we can be across the disciplines!

Maths

In Maths next term, we will begin to explore ratio and will look at how this links to proportion. It would be really helpful for you could support your child at home to continue to develop fluency in their times tables. There are a range of websites that have games to encourage regular practice, or you could create a game to play between you! Key vocabulary that we will explore are 'ratio' and 'proportion'.

Geography

We are looking forward to exploring the geography of Russia, including the various physical and human features, and the different climates across the country. Key vocabulary that we will be using include biome, climate, vegetation, biodiversity, adaptation and population.

Performing Arts

During Term 5,we will be looking at popular music and developing their solo and group performing skills and learning about theatre reviews and critics. They will be reviewing the National Theatre performance of *Peter Pan*



History

This term, we will be developing our skills as historians as we delve into The Reformation. We will be exploring different people in Tudor England, their interactions and how religion developed during this time. Vocabulary that we will explore is 'circumnavigation, dissolution, heir, heretic and reformation.

Health and Wellbeing

We have really enjoyed the wide variety of dishes that we have created so far this year and look forward to designing and making some more tasty treats as we continue to develop cooking skills this term. We will also be developing our skills in First Aid.
