
Special Opportunity for KOA Families

Uniform

Just a reminder for the new year that uniform is compulsory throughout our academy—from Reception to Year 11. I have included more detailed information on pages 3-4.

Heads of Year, class teachers and tutors have checked uniform today and will be working with parents / carers to support our children and families in meeting this expectation.

In Years R—6 only, children are currently able to wear their school PE kit on PE days. Non-school hoodies are not permitted to be worn at any time within the academy, including on PE days. In Years 7—11, children must wear their school uniform every day and must bring their PE kit to school in their bag. Please remember that jewellery (including earrings) are to be removed before Years R-6 come into school; in Y7-11, students will need to be able to remove jewellery when changing for PE.

Parking

We have received reports from our neighbours on Brook Road of unsafe parking such as obstructing driveways and partially obstructing the road.

Please can we ask that parents / carers who wish to use Brook Road to park to drop off or collect their children do so by parking respectfully and legally, ensuring that driveways and roads remain clear for residents and emergency vehicles if required.

There are a limited number of parking spaces available in the carpark accessed by Deanery Road for parents / carers to use and you are able to use the space in here to ensure safe turning of vehicles.



Year 7 Reading



To support our young people in developing the essential skill of reading, we are renewing our focus in this area.

To support this, we are asking that all Year 7 pupils to bring a book to school with them every day. This can be either a book that they are currently reading at home or a book which has been borrowed from our school library. This will become part of the Year 7 learners' expected equipment and tutors will, as part of ready-to-learn checks, be supporting their groups in developing and maintaining this expectation.

A Focus on GRIT!



Lower Body and Footwear

- Jeans, cords, chinos, stretchy fabric, flares, tracksuit bottoms, leggings, sports shorts or zip pockets are not permitted.
- Monkhouse grey tailored school skirt. This will be the only, approved uniform skirt. Please do not seek to
 purchase skirts from alternative
- Plain black school shoes or trainers
 - White/coloured logo based trainers, boots, high heels are not acceptable forms of footwear.

If your child attends school and is wearing one of the prohibited items listed above, they will be asked to change their clothes into the official uniform before attending lessons.
