



Dear Parents and Carers,

With only seven weeks, or 50 days, until Christmas, September seems just a distant memory now. With all the challenges of the last academic year and the continuation of rising Covid 19 cases in the area, our students have been amazing, battling through and getting the job done these past couple of months, and so I wanted to extend my thanks to them and to you all for your grit, perseverance, and determination to continue with learning at a difficult and challenging time, thank you.

Throughout last term our focus was very much on rebuilding relationships with students and staff and bringing everyone back together. Term 2 now leads us into supporting student confidence, self-belief, and well-being, and therefore over the coming weeks you will see and hear about a range of activities that are designed to support our students in driving forward their personal self-perception. We understand that without student confidence and self-belief their academic progress and potential will remain underachieved. During Wednesday afternoons, students will be invited, along with parents/carers, to attend a 15 minute 1:1 mentoring session with their tutor to help us understand and support each individual further, we hope you can attend. In addition to the tutor mentoring, we have now got an upper school learning mentor in post who will be working with selected students to really focus and address self-belief, confidence, and perseverance. So, as you can see, we will be doing a lot of reflecting on ourselves in the coming term and getting to grips with what is truly holding us back. I hope you can support us with this at home.

With the countdown to Christmas already started I'm sure, we have a busy term ahead of us. Year 11s are already in the middle of a two-week mock assessment window, and we have been incredibly proud of their maturity so far; and for those courses where students do not sit exams, coursework is now rapidly being completed and signed off. On top of this our Year 9 and 10 students are also preparing for the assessment point 1 exam window to open up in the next couple of weeks. I'm sure we can all take ourselves back to that feeling of worry and nervousness about a pending exam or assessment and so again I ask you all to check in on each other and support your students through another nervous period and offer them the confidence they need to achieve.

Remember "***Confidence isn't walking into a room with your nose in the air, and thinking you are better than everyone else. It's walking into a room and not having to compare yourself to anyone else in the first place***".

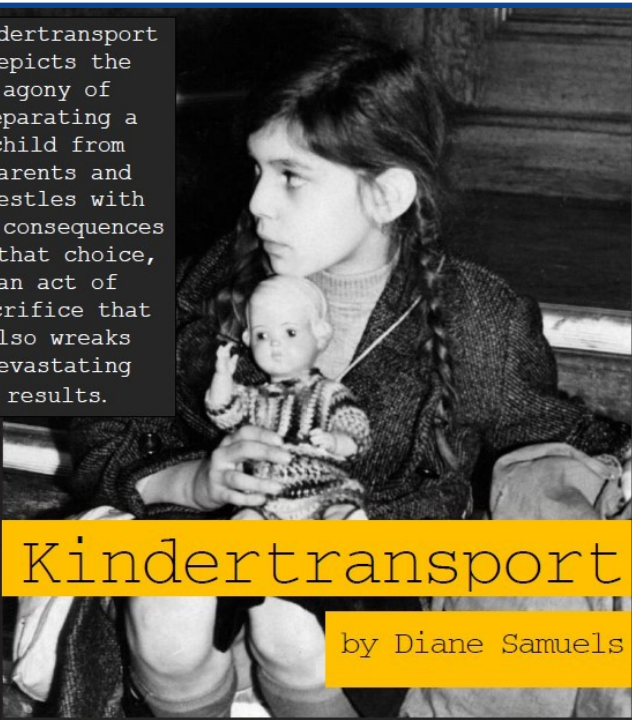

In the meantime, they have been completing artist research to inspire their own work. This fantastic piece was created by Connor L in class and finished in his own time. Wonderful work!

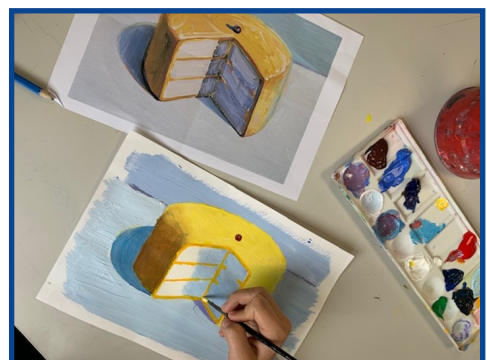


Year 10 Art

The Art department is delighted with the progress Year 10 are making on their artist studies in acrylic paint. For many students it is the first time they have used acrylic and WOW! What results!

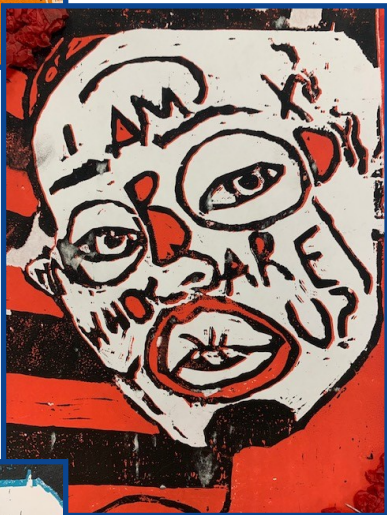
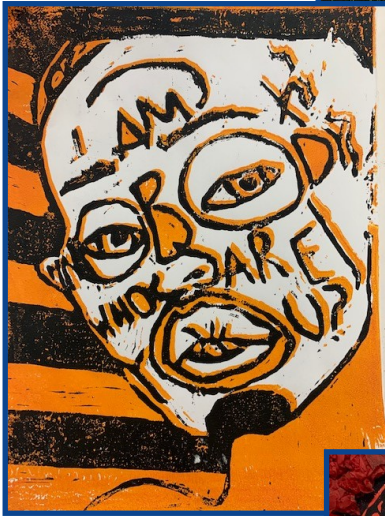
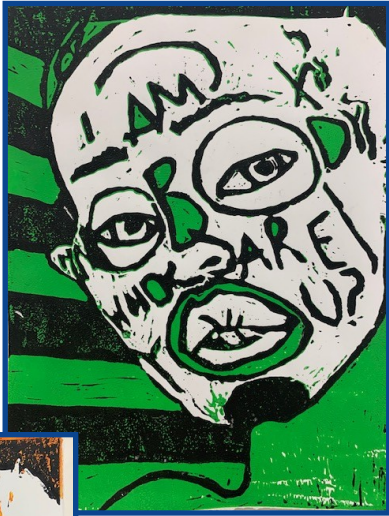
We have been studying the work of Wayne Thiebaud. By copying artists' work students can then go on to use these skills and techniques in their own compositions.

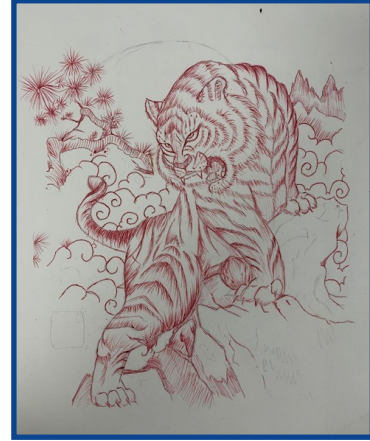
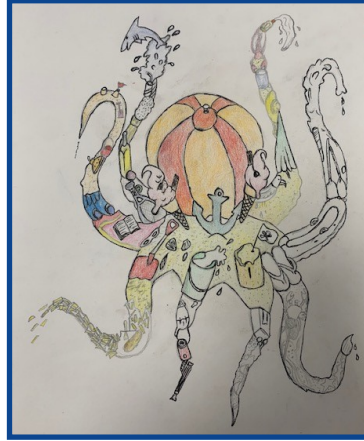
Year 11 Art
