## Governance Update

My name is Tricia Brabham and I am the Deputy Head of Governance for CLF. Along with my colleagues Liz Tincknell (Head of Governance), Will Lamb (Information Governance Coordinator), and Jackie Friday (Governance Administrator), we work closely with the Trust Board and Academy Councils (the name we give to our Local Governing Boards), on all areas of governance.



Our Academy Councils are made up of volunteers from the local community, as well as parents and staff and they have an important role in providing appropriate challenge and support to the Principal to provide the best educational experience for all students. The Academy Council meets 6 times a year, with the Principal and members of the Senior Leadership Team, in addition individual councillors may link to a particular area of school to be able to provide strategic oversight to the Academy Council on the work taking place in this area. On occasion they may also sit on panels to consider exclusions or complaints.

We have vacancies across our Trust for Academy Councillors - you don't need a background in education, but be willing and able to commit time to the role, to ask questions, and to analyse data. We provide training for our councillors, and they have the support of a clerk and the wider governance team to help them in their role.

## Gardening at KOA

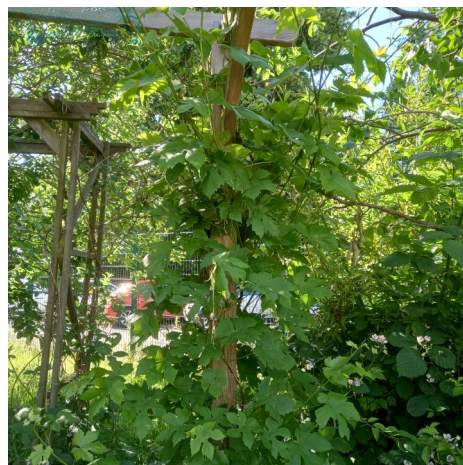

## French at KOA

### KS4 trip to Paris

On 28 June Mrs Marie-Anaïs, accompanied by Mrs Gribble, Mrs Thielen and Mr Heath took a group of 35 KS4 students to Paris for a 4-day trip to the sunny French capital city, as the municipality is getting ready to host the 2024 Olympic Games. Good use was made of our time and the visits included a range of fun and educational activities to explore the cultural aspects of Parisian life. Amongst those activities, students saw the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier under the Arc de Triomphe and climbed the 284 steps to the top of the Arch, where the most beautiful views of Paris can be seen.

We also went on a relaxing sightseeing cruise in the heart of Paris along the River Seine and saw beautiful and historical monuments like Notre Dame cathedral and La Conciergerie, where thousands of prisoners were kept, including Marie Antoinette.

We visited Le Louvre Museum and saw masterpieces like *Mona Lisa* by Leonardo da Vinci and *La Liberté guidant le peuple* by Eugène Delacroix. The following day was packed with laughter as students spent the day at Disneyland. Students had such a good time that we decided to stay a bit longer to enjoy the many rides and to top it all the weather was good!



Our students were great ambassadors to KOA and made us feel proud and privileged to be their teachers. I wish to thank all parties involved, especially the students. Everyone's contribution made this visit a truly successful and enjoyable experience, which we shall repeat in the future!

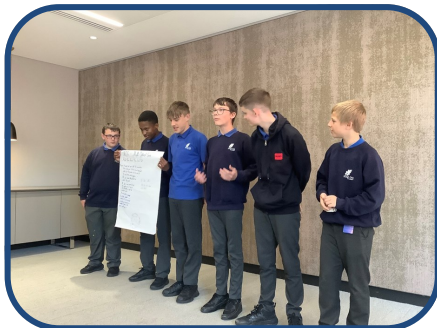
## STEM at KOA

Eleven Year 9 girls attended a local STEM event at MBDA Filton, where they were inspired by female role models sharing their career pathways and achievements. The students engaged in team-building activities that enhanced their communication, leadership, and teamwork skills. They also participated in an engineering challenge, designing a bridge according to a specific brief. The girls collaborated exceptionally well, producing impressive bridge designs that withstood the testing procedures. Throughout the event, the students represented the school excellently and were motivated by the successful women they met.



## KPMG STEM visit

Forty Year 9 students embarked on a visit to the KPMG offices in Bristol. KPMG operates in 145 countries worldwide, providing audit, tax, and advisory services. Overall, a great morning was had by all. Well done Year 9!

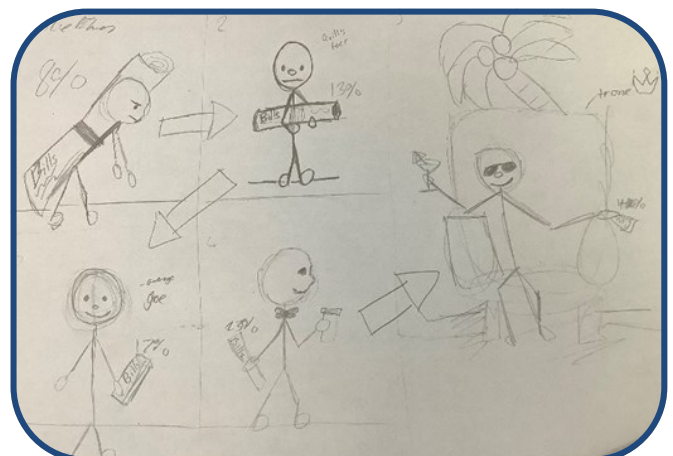


## STEM Girls in Maths Day

Staff from Future Quest and student ambassadors from UWE kept our students entertained with a series of interactive workshops all focused on the benefits of a higher education, and a tour of the campus – our students were particularly impressed by the School of Engineering, Sports Academy, and of course the on-site Greggs!



### Saint Brendan's Discovery Day

Saint Brendan's Sixth Form is a specialist sixth-form college local to King's Oak and it's always a popular choice for our students. This year our Year 10 students were invited to attend a 'discovery day', where they were able to sample three A level subjects of their choosing, and to have a wander around the site to see what college life is all about! Particular highlights included a 'whodunnit' forensic science challenge in Chemistry, and designing 3D seating areas in DT!



### Mock Interviews

As adults, we know how challenging a job interview can be – we are often out of our comfort zone, and it can be difficult to talk about ourselves! This is especially difficult for our young people who are thinking of applying for apprenticeships to go on to after school, but are put off by the intimidating interview process. As part of our annual careers programme, at the end of Term 6 our Year 10s braved a mock interview process, kindly supported by volunteers from businesses within our local community, including members of the Kingswood Rotary Club, Bristol and Bath Science Park and Lloyds Bank.

## Performing Arts at KOA

### Farewell

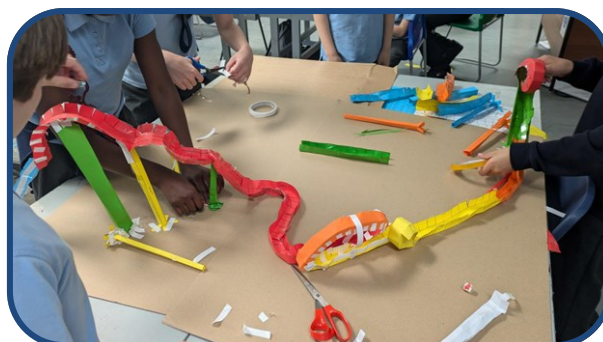
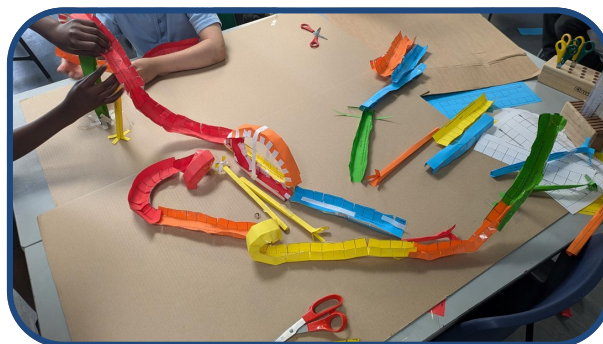

The students showed great teamwork and problem-solving skills!



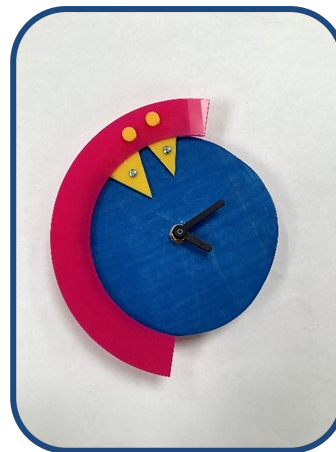
### Year 7 DT

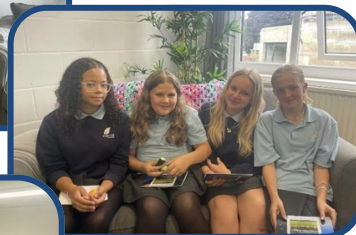

## Reception to Year 6 Sports Day

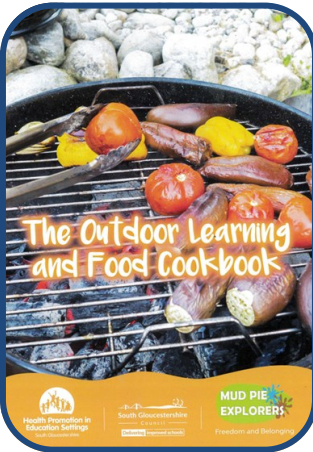


Congratulations to all the children and families on a fantastic Sports Day this term! Your enthusiasm, effort and team spirit truly shone through, making

## South Gloucestershire Outdoor Learning and Food Project



Our Reception children enjoyed being part of the South Gloucestershire Outdoor Learning and Food project this year. They worked with Mrs Lindsey and the Reception team to plant and tend to herbs and cooked their very own mini carrot cakes and wrote recipes. We shared these with project organisers who published recipes in a very special cookbook, along with those of other participating schools!

### King's Oak Academy Mini Carrot Cakes

- Preparation time: 30 mins.
- Cooking time: 20 mins.

#### Ingredients

- 125g (4oz) carrots
- 100g (3½oz) sugar
- 75g (3oz) margarine (may contain milk)
- 100g plain flour
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1 tsp Baking Powder (some types contain gluten / wheat)
- 1 large egg
- 60g (2oz) sultanas (some packets may contain sulphites)

#### Method

- Ask an adult to preheat the oven to gas mark 6, 200°C or fan 180°C before they top and tail the carrot.
- Peel and grate the carrots into a bowl.
- Add the sugar and margarine and mix all the ingredients together. Sift the flour into the bowl, along with the baking powder. Add the cinnamon.
- Crack the egg into a bowl and beat it before adding it to the cake mixture.
- Add the sultanas and stir again. You could try swapping these for other dried fruits like cranberries or apricots.
- With the help of an adult, divide the mixture equally between the cupcake cases using two metal spoons. This part can get messy so be careful!
- Ask an adult to place the carrot cakes into the oven to bake for 15 to 20 minutes until they're golden and piping hot throughout.
- Ask an adult to remove them from the oven and allow them to cool. They should bounce back when you press the top with a finger and a skewer inserted into the middle should come out clean with no raw cake mixture on it.
- Decorate however you like - you can get really creative here!

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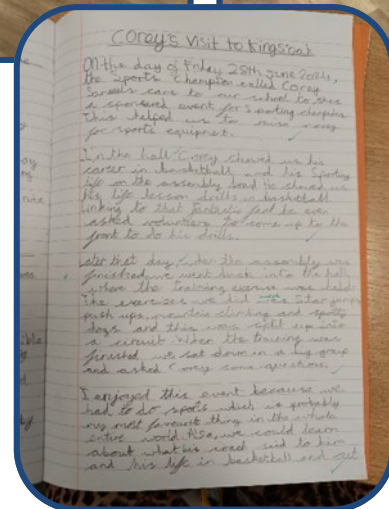


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## Corey Samuels' visit

Wow, everyone – what an amazing year! Year 1 have been busy this term learning as Historians about how technology has developed over the last century, and the impact it has had on our lives.

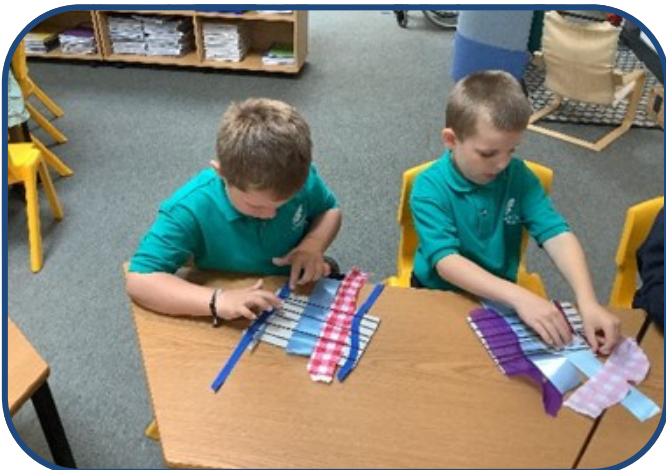
We loved our very active Fitness Week, where we explored the Forest School provision and took part in sports day.

Once we had our designs we tried to narrow them down by being realistic with the level of challenges.

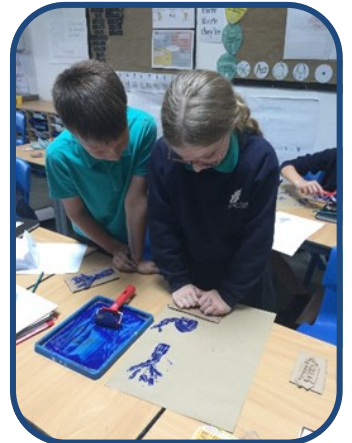
We then moved on to the develop process where we used scraps of felt to apply our running stitch skills before working on the deliver stage of our final product.

## News from Year 4

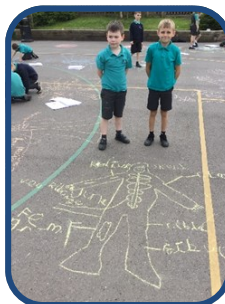
As part of our transition to Year 5, we have taken part in Forest School on the middle school site. We have explored our new area and created wooden plaques to make it our own. We have also used a map to navigate the area and created bush trails using natural resources.



This term we have focussed on developing our printing skills in Art. First, we designed and made a collagraph block. Then we used a roller technique to print. Our final piece included a repeating pattern and up to 3 colours.



As scientists, we have investigated the musculoskeletal system. We have learned the names of the main bones in our body and used tape measures to measure our own bones. We have also found out why we need muscles and how they work in pairs to contract and relax.

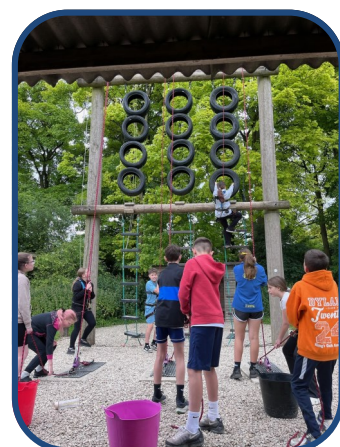
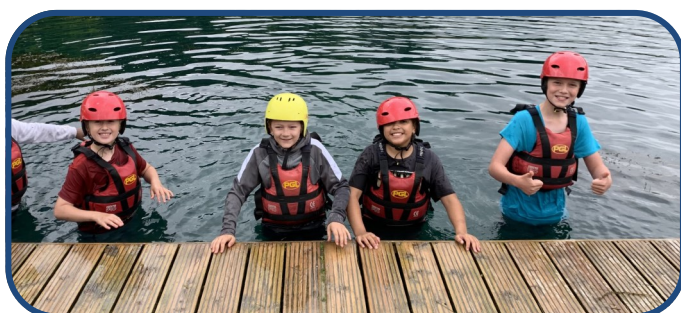
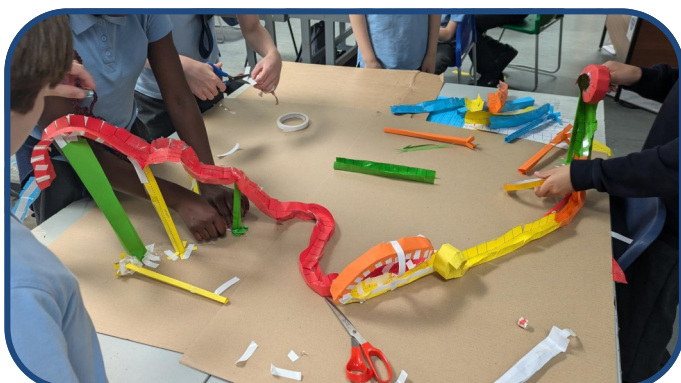
#### Sports for Champions

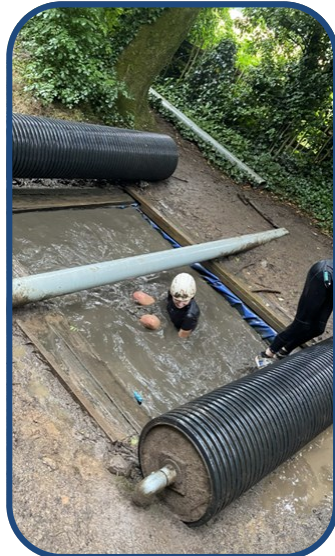

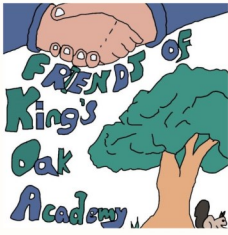

We have a new Facebook group for you to sell your pre-loved uniform. We plan to sell our own uniform stock on there as well as hopefully, hold an in person sale next term.

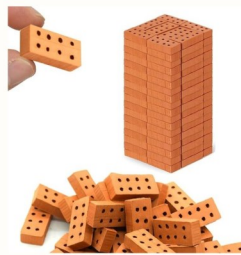

**SCHOOL HOLIDAY CYCLE TRAINING COURSES**

## **BEFORE BOOKING YOUR COURSE, PLEASE READ BELOW CAREFULLY!**

- All courses are subject to a £5 Booking Fee which is Non-refundable.
- Places are limited so these are booked on a first come basis.
- The child must have a roadworthy bike with 2 working brakes and have a properly fitting helmet.

### **Bikeability Learn to Ride**

**This session is for children who are unable to cycle, including older children who have never mastered the skill. Session 1 ½ hours. This course is for School Year 3 and above.**

### **Level 2**

**Consists of two morning sessions, there is an initial assessment in the playground covering level 1 skills to ensure they are ready for on road training. Once out on the road they will learn about road position, which road user has priority and when, how to recognise typical hazards as well as manoeuvring through junctions. This course is for School Year 6 and above who can cycle.**

### **Level 3**

**Aims to equip riders with skills for more challenging roads and traffic situations such as passing queuing traffic, road narrowing, understanding blind spots and how to perceive and deal with hazards. All riders MUST have completed a level 2 course to an acceptable level prior to enrolling on this course. An acceptable level is where on the back of their level 2 certificate each box is ticked either Independently or With More Practice. If any of the boxes are ticked as either With Some Assistance or Not Yet Attempted they should attend another level 2 course. Most riders will need time to absorb the level 2 skills and put these into practice, hence they MUST NOT attend a level 2 and level 3 course within the same holiday period.**
