### Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope that your child has enjoyed their return to school this week and that they have been able to reconnect with their teachers and class peers. In Term 2 I updated you on our SENCo recruitment process and confirmed that we had appointed a new SENCo due to start with us in January 2022. Sadly, due to personal reasons, the appointed SENCo is no longer able to take up the position at King's Oak Academy.

We are now advertising for a new SENCo to be recruited and appointed to start in September 2022 (or earlier if possible). I want to reassure you that in the interim we have put in place robust arrangements to ensure that for the remainder of the academic year our children with additional learning needs are well supported and the academy meets its statutory obligations within the SEND Code of Practice.

### These measures include:

#### **SEND Leadership**

- Each Head of School (Jo Thorn Lower School, Rebecca Thielen Middle School and Andrew Marshall-Aherne Upper School) will be leading SEND student provision in their respective schools. All Heads of School are moving to non-teaching timetables for the remainder of the academic year to ensure that they have sufficient capacity to work with families and teachers so that appropriate provision plans are implemented and statutory meetings such as Annual Reviews are completed.
- o In Term 2 we funded additional SEND leadership support from a local specialist SEND support company called SENCAT. Tracy Nairn has worked closely with King's Oak Academy in previous years and has worked with both the Heads of School and Megan to; complete annual reviews, quality assure SEND paperwork, provide SEND training to Teaching Partners and SEND leadership training to the Heads of School. We have also allocated additional funding within our school budget for Tracy to continue to work with us in January.
- Megan Redwood will continue to lead as Deputy SENCo. Megan works closely with the Heads of School, Teachers and Teaching Partners to ensure that students with additional learning needs receive appropriate and effective academic and/or well-being support.
- The Cabot Learning Federation and South Gloucestershire Local Authority SEND Team are continuing to provide strategic guidance and additional SEND capacity through SEND network meetings, executive leadership support and Code of Practice quality assurance reviews.

# <u>Graduated Response Tracking (Assess, Plan, Do, Review)</u>

• We have purchased an online SEND provision planning tool called Edukey. This tool allows teachers to access up to date SEN information, share your child's learning targets and communicate additional provision that they might have access to. All teachers have received training on this software and class tutors are now completing the initial plan-do-review meetings for students with SEN K needs. To maintain open and transparent communication systems, we plan to share access to this tool with parents in Term 5.
