Curriculum

King's Oak Academy has the unique opportunity to build your child's knowledge, skills and understanding of key concepts and ideas from the Early Years Foundation Stage (Reception) up to Key Stage 4 (Year 11).

Our programme of study is designed to give your child a broad and balanced learning experience and in lessons, your child can immerse themselves in becoming a scientist, writer, artist or athlete to master the fundamentals in each area of the curriculum.

As our values demonstrate, we believe in maintaining high expectations in everything

we do but also remaining inclusive for all and therefore teaching is deliberately designed to challenge and support all students to reach their full potential, regardless of their starting points.

What happens next?

The section below offers a short summary about what to expect once you have visited our King's Oak Academy open event.



September to December

- During this time it is likely that you will be visiting several schools to decide where you would like your child to learn in September.
- After speaking to teachers and visiting schools, the local authority will ask you to submit your school choice preferences.

March

You will receive confirmation from South Gloucestershire or Bristol Council about which school your child will attend in September. If you are joining King's Oak, we will be happy to answer any questions that you might have and you are also welcome to visit the school again or meet with any of us on request.

April, May and June


Transition into Lower School: We understand the significance of children starting their educational journey and as such the transition process contains several steps. Once your child has been allocated

a place in our academy every family will receive a phone call from the teaching team to say hello and have an initial 'getting to know you' conversation. Based on this we may decide to visit some children in their pre-school or home setting. Parents are then invited to an information session in June, where the Head of the Lower School, Early Years Leader, Class Teachers and SENCO will introduce themselves. At this meeting parents are given a pack containing all information relating to starting school. During transition week children and parents/ carers will be invited to a 'stay and play' session. This is an opportunity for children to come and explore the Lower School learning base in an informal way with their adult. In September, there is a short but important transition period where we will complete a home visit and invite children to start school on a part time timetable. This will enable adults to really get to know children in those first weeks and build strong, lasting relationships. All children will be attending the Lower School full time by the end of September.









Transition into Middle School: We will be visiting every single child and their Year 6 teacher in the primary schools. We will be gaining as much information as we can from the primary school. This will include academic data but also things like behaviour, likes and dislikes, friendships, extracurricular interests and personality traits. For any students with additional or special educational needs, our Special Educational Needs Team, will meet with their primary school counterparts to make sure that we have all the relevant information needed so that we can continue to meet the child's needs in the best possible way. During this period of time, we will also have some pre-transition visits for students who might be slightly more vulnerable and need that extra support with transition. They will come to King's Oak with a key member of staff from their primary school and will often work with their prospective Key Worker from here as well.

Late June - Early July

Big Step Week (Transition).

Lower School: In the Lower School children will take part in several transition events to ensure transition is smooth. If your child needs more preparation to manage change, they will have a short, meaningful time to meet their next teacher; we refer to this as 'tea and tips'. This is an informal opportunity to say hello, play a game and talk about themselves in a way they perhaps might not in a larger group. All children will take part in 'picnic and bubbles' during

Big Step week. This is a relaxed session where new classes will share stories, play games, have drinks and snacks whilst building those new relationships and friendships. Finally, children will spend the day with their new teachers in what will be their new classrooms. Children will spend the day engaged in art, music, community building activities and playing games. It is an opportunity for teachers to begin to set expectations of the new year group and alleviate any anxieties. At the end of this day parents will have an opportunity to meet the teacher. Middle School: We believe a large part of transition is to make new friends and orient themselves around the academy. Your child will be offered a transition day to come and experience what a day will be like for them at King's Oak Academy. We will be in contact with your child's primary setting shortly.

You will also be invited to join our new parent welcome evening where we will share advice about how to support your child as they transition into Year 7 and offer an insight into what your child can expect when they start at King's Oak in September.











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
