Message from Craig Jones—Head of Lower School

Thank you to everyone for welcoming me to the King's Oak community. As Principal of Haywood Village Academy (Weston-super-Mare) and as part of the Cabot Learning Federation (CLF), I am enjoying the opportunity to support KOA Lower School during this period of transition before the new Head of Lower School joins in September.

Alongside Miss Ogden and other senior leaders, I will continue next term to be on the Lower School site on Wednesday afternoons, Thursdays and Fridays all day.

My role is to support the daily activity of the Lower School and also contribute to longer term strategic improvement. Recent developments have included: providing teaching and learning feedback to teachers to support their skills, planning staff meetings to coordinate lower school improvement work and supporting updates to the behaviour policy. It has been really great to enjoy hearing and seeing the enrichment that has been offered: Year 4 and 6 on camp, puppetry in Year 5, a trip to the SS Great Britain for Year 2 and an animal expert with live animals for Year 1.

It has been hugely exciting to have the Living Eggs programme in our classroom.

Year 2 News

Year 2 this term, have been exploring 'How the Victorians changed Britain'.

On our Victorian day they immersed themselves in the lives of Victorian School Children. They have learned about Queen Victoria, the Industrial Revolution and other key Victorian figures such as Isambard Kingdom Brunel. They have explored a range of Victorian inventions and designed their own version of the Clifton Suspension Bridge which needed to withstand a certain weight. The children represented King's Oak brilliantly with their behaviour on their school trip to the SS Great Britain where they had a fantastic time, despite the weather.

Year 9 News


Term 5 has been a term filled with lots of exciting opportunities for Year 9 students and they have had the chance to take part in lots of different events:

All students showed how creative they were, as well as developed their ability to successfully problem-solve and be able to present their ideas to a group. Well done to all students who took part.

Duke of Edinburgh

Sixteen Year 9 students took part in the expedition section of this award in the Mendips. This included an overnight stay in tents and cooking on a gas stove. Students had to plan a route and navigate this for six hours each day. Despite the compostable toilets and lack of showers, students enjoyed themselves and even found time to play football and enjoy the rope swing on the evening. Well done to all students who took part.



Breaking the Chain

Year 9 students were also involved in a theatre production called 'Breaking the Chain'. This performance aimed to raise awareness, kickstart conversations, and build resilience around youth violence with a focus on knife crime. The company came into school and Year 9 students watched an hourlong performance involving making the right choices regarding the pressure to carry knives. The feedback from students was really positive and they felt that the performance helped them to understand the pressures involved with this and understand the pressure others may be under.
