Year 9 STEM Discovery Day

Twenty eight Year 9 students participated in a STEM Crest Discovery Day hosted at Mewburn Ellis, a Bristol-based law firm. Collaborating in small teams, the students engaged in designing sustainable products, receiving guidance from associates within the firm. Subsequently, they showcased their concepts to the firm's partners, defending their designs and fielding numerous inquiries.

Demonstrating remarkable dedication, the students produced impressive results by the end of the visit. Moreover, they gained insights into the connection of law and STEM disciplines. Completing their introductory module for a Crest Award, all students received certificates and left with a wealth of ideas regarding STEM career paths. Credit to all students for representing the school extremely well.


Year 8 STEM Workshop

On international Women's Day, 26 of our Year 8 students attended a STEM workshop at Renishaw. Students created their own colour changing torches, building the circuits and structure themselves. They worked with Gillian, a mechanical engineer, who spoke about how she got into engineering and the challenges she faced.

The students learnt about careers in STEM and the possible routes they could take after their GCSEs. They looked at famous scientists from the past and how engineering is now changing our world!

It was amazing to see the super cool tech at Renishaw and the students showed our values, of work hard, be kind brilliantly.











Science Week at KOA

This term, our academy hosted an engaging British Science Week, offering a diverse range of activities tailored to students of all ages. Aligned with this year's British Science Week Theme, 'Time', students from Years 7 to Year 11 participated in tutor-led activities aimed at conquering stereotypes in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM). These sessions included a comprehensive science quiz to test students' understanding of scientific concepts.

Students in Years 5 to 8 benefited from an enlightening assembly delivered by a STEM ambassador affiliated with Airbus. The presentation, centered around the theme of time, intertwined with the ambassador's aerospace career in Airbus, sparking thought-provoking questions among the students.

Years 9 to 11 were privileged to attend inspirational assemblies hosted by esteemed local companies such as Renishaw and GE Aerospace, shedding light on lucrative career opportunities in STEM fields.

Additionally, students in Years 1 to 9 had the opportunity to showcase their creativity in a poster competition, currently undergoing evaluation by our judging panel. Winning entries will be submitted to the National competition.

Furthermore, Key Stage 2 students participated in a live BBC lesson on Time, while classes spanning from Reception to Year 9 engaged in STEM-focused activities throughout the week.

Concluding the week's activities, students were invited to observe a squid dissection in the Hexagon, delivered by one of our Science teachers, Miss Rowley.


Overall, Science Week proved to be a stimulating and enjoyable experience for all. Plans are already in motion to expand and enhance the event for next year!

Drama

In Year 8, students have been on a whistle-stop tour of the works of William Shakespeare including Othello, A Midsummer Night's Dream and Romeo and Juliet, developing their vocal skills.

Year 9 have been doing taster sessions in preparation for the BTEC Performing Arts course at Key Stage 4 what a wealth of talent, confidence and creativity we are seeing from the next generation of Performing Arts students.

Music

Year 7 students have been studying 'great composers' and their music. They have been listening 'musically' to famous pieces and performing some, especially

Beethoven's ODE TO JOY (from his 9th Symphony) which has been a set piece they have been practising in preparation for their DOOYA assessment.

Year 9 have been creating music for moving image including horror, romance and documentary genres.

Y7 Art students to continue working on their background for their final <u>self portrait</u> drawing in the style of K Wiley. Students have been using mix media to create their background.

















Y8 Art, students have been working on their comic strips for their story, students also revisited facial features and facial proportion. Some fantastic work to finish off this project.




Year 9

Y9 Art, students had opportunities looking at different architects, created an artist research page before looking to design their own poly tile, then we use the design to make multiple


prints inspired by the architect that we studied.














Year 10

In Term 4, we have been learning about castles and royalty, dinosaurs, Ramadan and Easter! What a busy


term. We also had a wonderful day celebrating books for World Book Day. We are working hard as writers embedding effective pen grip, letter formation and spelling when writing.





In music this term we have been using musical notation to compose our own melodies. We started by writing three bars of notes and practised clapping the rhythm. We progressed to using instruments and then iPads.












As computer scientists, we have written our own algorithms on Logo. We used the code snippets to write our initials and used the repeat command to create patterns with our letters.







The focus of the workshop was 'Belonging' and encouraged students to think about where they belong in different groups and communities. 


This term, we've been working very hard in our Authors unit and developed some incredible prequel




