### Dear Parents/Carers

I would like to thank each of you for the exceptional way you and your child/ren have managed in the face of adversity throughout the pandemic and I hope that you have been able to have a restful summer holiday. We are delighted to welcome all students back to school in September and throughout the summer period, our premises, health and safety and leadership team have continued to monitor the government and local authority guidance closely so that we are appropriately prepared to welcome back your child/ren the week commencing 6 September 2021.

I know that everyone's story throughout the pandemic has been different and some people have fought very hard battles with bereavement, health worries, financial worries, mental health and anxiety challenges on top of the isolation and juggling home learning. Whatever your circumstances we want next year to be a time of positive learning, creating new relationships and building safe routines.

As you can imagine, at the start of term there will be a lot of information for us to share with your child. To enable us to welcome them in September, we have arranged a staggered induction programme for all year groups across the academy (see page 2). Schools have also been asked to supervise two on-site Covid (Lateral Flow) tests at the start of term. We want to do this as quickly and effectively as possible within a week so that school can start uninterrupted by Monday 13 September.

Students in Year 7 - 11 will complete their first of two 'return to school' lateral flow tests (LFT) during their Induction Session. The second LFT will then take place during the school day on either the Thursday 9 or Friday 10 (3 days after their first LFT).

It is important that we work together to minimise the likelihood of students congregating in large groups outside the academy therefore please ensure that your child arrives at the school between the specified times only.

From 6 September 2021, to reduce traffic congestion, improve pedestrian safety and encourage more students to walk/cycle to school, Brook Road will continue to be closed to all vehicles at the start and end of the school day (except emergency vehicles and students with blue badge access requirements).

The road closure times will be between 0825 - 0850 and 1500 - 1520. If you intend to drive your child to school, we suggest that over the weekend you discuss and agree with your child where the safe drop off/collection point will be.

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#### **Break/Lunchtime Provision**

## **Year 7-11 Catering Arrangements**

Currently, we are building a new school canteen (more information can be found <a href="here">here</a>). We hope that the canteen will be open and operational in May 2022.

Whilst the canteen is being built, we need to continue to make alternative catering arrangements for Year 7-11.

During the induction sessions on Monday 6 and Tuesday 7 September, please would Year 7 students bring a packed lunch and water bottle to school, unless they receive Free School Meals.

From Wednesday 8 September we would recommend students bring a packed lunch to school each day. However, if you would like your child to have a school lunch the following system will be used:

- An online form will be sent (via Insight) to all parents each Wednesday. The form will allow you to:
  - Select what lunch grab bag (hot and cold options available) meals you would like your child to have each day for the following week. The menu will rotate on a fortnightly basis and costs for each meal will be indicated on the form.
    - Unfortunately, once you have chosen your child's lunch options, we will not be able to amend this if your child changes their mind on the day.

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- Confirm that you have paid the total cost of the pre-booked meals using our online payment system.
  - This is not required for students that receive free school meals
- The deadline to pre-order food for the following week will be Friday 1.30pm.
- Lunches will be delivered to the 'Snack Shack' for students to collect each day.
- The first lunch booking form will be sent to parents on Thursday 2 September.

If you do not have online/computer access, please call 01179 927127 and we will be able to set up a paper based ordering system for you to complete.















N.B. If your child is unwell/unable to attend school and you have pre-booked a meal, please be assured that we will not prepare a meal for them/deduct the cost of the lunch from your account.

## **Student Timetables / Planners**

**Year 7-11 only** - During your child's induction sessions they will receive their 2021-22 timetable and homework planner.

#### **Uniform:**

Please ensure that your child is wearing the KOA Uniform (outlined <u>here</u>) to their respective induction sessions.

We are aware that it has been reported our uniform suppliers, Monkhouse, have experienced some delays in their ordering/delivery schedules. Please feel reassured that we will do our utmost to support families whose uniform has not arrived on time.

If your child's uniform has been ordered and is delayed, your child may wear an unbranded version of the uniform item (e.g. Lower School – Plain Jade Polo / Middle School – Plain V-Neck Navy Jumper). Please write a note in their planner to confirm this and we will issue a 'uniform exemption card'.

## Academy hygiene routines

We will continue to maintain strong hygiene routines and control measures to reduce the risk of covid-19 transmission in the community. This will include:

- Regular hand cleaning and sanitisation
- Positive air ventilation, i.e. windows and doors remaining open
- Cleaners working on-site throughout the academy day cleaning communal areas and key touch points (e.g. doors / windows / toilets)
- Students sitting in allocated seats

We will also continue to follow Public Health England (PHE) guidance with regards to testing, managing positive cases and self-isolation. King's Oak Academy and Cabot Learning Federation will also have an 'outbreak management strategy' that will be utilised if there is a significant rise in positive covid-19 cases in 2021-22.

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### **Face Coverings**

Following the most receive government update, face coverings will no longer be compulsory for students or teachers on the academy site. However, if you would like your child to wear a face covering whilst they are moving between lessons (e.g. in corridors) they will be permitted to wear one if they choose to do so.

We would recommend that if your child does intend to wear a face covering in corridors or when travelling to and from school that you ensure they have a plastic, zip locked bag so that they can store the covering when they enter classrooms.

#### **Movement between lessons**

In nearly all cases across the all-through, teachers will continue to teach from a consistent classroom and they will be responsible for maintaining strong hygiene/health and safety routines in their classroom.

# Behaviour during the academy day

Whilst we will be delighted to welcome all of our students back to the Academy in September, it is important that we maintain high expectations and standards of behaviour throughout the academy day. To ensure that all students are able to access a high quality education and pastoral care, we have updated our recognition and consequences systems to include specific adjustments that are associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

During your child's return to school induction day in September we will explain how your child's learning and behaviours will be recognised and celebrated. We will also explain to your child how we expect them to work hard and be kind. This information will be shared in our Behaviour Policy on the academy website from Tuesday 7 September.

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
