## **Dear Parents and Carers**

Firstly, I would like to say a massive well done to all the Year 11 students on the positive start they have made this term. Year 11 teachers and tutors have commented that attitude towards learning has been excellent in lessons.

As we look towards the future, we will be putting a lot of support in place to help our young people achieve the best results possible for their GCSEs later in the academic year. To help us with this we will be running some Year 11 intervention sessions. Below is some key information for you:

## Parent Information Evening

We are running a Year 11 Parent Information evening on **Tuesday 1 October from 5:30pm-7:00pm**. This will be a chance to find out more about your child's upcoming exams. Attending this event will also be representatives from local Post-16 providers, who will be able to offer information on your child's further education and options.

## Intervention Sessions, Study Skills and Spaces

We will be using afternoon tutor times to teach students study skills so that they can prepare effectively for upcoming exams. As the mock exams near, we will be opening a dedicated study space for Year 11s to access during lunch time.
